## GIGW Certification provided for eTaal Project

Guidelines for Indian Government Websites (GIGW) have been developed to avail standardisation and uniformity in websites belonging to the government. These Guidelines have been framed with an objective to make the Indian Government Websites conform to the essential pre-requisites of UUU trilogy i.e. Usable, User-Centric and Universally Accessible. They also form the basis for obtaining Website Quality Certification from STQC (Standardisation Testing Quality Certification) an attached office of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Government of India.

eTaal is one of the three projects from NIC that have been certified by STQC so far.

eTaal portal provides the e-Transactions count of e-Services delivered to the citizens across the country. eTaal has a nationwide acceptability as data is being captured for approx. 3062 e-Services from 21 Central Ministries, 36 States/UTs and 20 Mission Mode Projects (MMPs). Around 1723 crore transactions have been recorded so far since the inception of the project in 2013.
